Year 5 Spring 2 – Into the Jungle.

Key Skills

- To understand about weather patterns around the world and relate these to climate zones.
- To understand and use a wide range of geographical terms e.g. climate zones, biomes, volcanoes, mountains, earthquakes, vegetation belts, and rainforests.

Key Facts

- There are 4 main climate zones around the world; Tropical, Subtropical, Temperate and Polar.
- The Earth's interior is made up of 4 layers: the crust, the mantle, outer core, and inner core.
- Volcanoes are formed when the upper mantle mixes and moves which creates pressure. This can cause the mantle to leak onto the Earth's surface.
- Plants and animals need a male and female to reproduce.
- The cycle of life: birthadolescent – adult – reproduction – death.
- Different species reproduce in different ways.
- There are 3 primary colours. Mixing these together makes the secondary colours. This creates the colour wheel.

Key Vocabulary

A Biome - is a large community of plants and wildlife adapted to a specific climate.

The Mantle - is the mostly solid bulk of Earth's interior. The mantle lies between the crust and the outer core.

Tectonic Plates – making up the Earth's lithosphere (the crust). These plates move and interact with one another.

Reproduction - is the process by which new life is made.

Mammal – an animal, with a backbone, where the young are fed on milk.

Amphibian – is born in water and breathes with gills but develops lungs so it can live on land.

Species- plants and animals that reproduce with one another to continue the life cycle.

Colour Wheel - A colour circle, based on red, yellow and blue.
