


<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Identify &amp; name a variety of common animals including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds &amp; mammals.</li> <li>Describe &amp; compare the structure of a variety of common animals.</li> <li>Observe changes across the four seasons.</li> <li>Name, describe &amp; compare familiar places &amp; link their homes with other places in community.</li> <li>Use locational &amp; directional language (e.g., near &amp; far; left &amp; right) to describe the location of features &amp; routes.</li> <li>Understand how some places are linked to other places e.g. roads, trains.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Fish &amp; mammals live in the sea.</li> <li>Animals adapt to live in their environment.</li> <li>The beach can be a place of fun &amp; danger.</li> <li>At the seaside, we see a variety of different physical &amp; man-made features, including the dunes, hills, piers &amp; wind turbines.</li> <li>With the seasons changing, we see changes to weather &amp; day length.</li> <li>Food chains are important to keep life going &amp; if one part is removed, animals can become extinct.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>Physical features</b> - Things that you can see around you that would be here even if humans were not, such as dunes, mountains &amp; volcanoes.</li> <li><b>Manmade Features</b> - Things made &amp; put there by man, such as wind turbines, piers &amp; houses.</li> <li><b>Dunes</b> - Sandy hills which provide a natural defence against coastal erosion/the sea.</li> <li><b>Adapt</b> - the way things change</li> <li><b>Environment</b> - the place where things can live.</li> </ul>
