

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Use simple equipment to observe closely including changes over time.</li> <li>• Gather data and record data to help in answering questions</li> <li>• Perform simple comparative tests</li> <li>• Name and locate the world's seven continents and five oceans</li> <li>• Identify hot and cold areas of the world</li> <li>• select techniques to create a chosen product and develop some care and control over materials and their use.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Antarctica is the southernmost continent on Earth</li> <li>• The five oceans are Pacific, Atlantic, Indian, Southern and Arctic</li> <li>• The seven continents are Asia, Africa, North and South America, Antarctica, Europe, and Australia</li> <li>• The equator is an imaginary line in the middle of the Earth- it is halfway between the North and South Pole.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Equator</b>- an imaginary line in the middle of the Earth separating the North and South Pole</li> <li>• <b>Continent</b> – a large solid area of land (Earth has seven in total)</li> <li>• <b>Ocean</b>- a large area of water between continents (there are 5 main oceans on Earth)</li> <li>• <b>Compare</b> – to note or describe the similarities or differences of.</li> <li>• <b>Hemisphere</b> – one of the halves of the earth as divided by the equator (Northern Hemisphere and Southern Hemisphere)</li> </ul>
