

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Use maps, atlases, globes and digital/computer mapping to locate countries and describe features.</li> <li>Use fieldwork to observe and record the human and physical features in the local area using a range of methods including sketch maps, plans and graphs and digital technologies.</li> <li>Name and locate the Equator, Northern Hemisphere, Southern Hemisphere, the Tropics of Cancer and Capricorn, Arctic and Antarctic Circle and date time zones.</li> <li>Describe some of the characteristics of these geographical areas.</li> <li>Describe geographical similarities and differences between countries.</li> <li>Describe how the locality of the school has changed over time.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The Amazon covers 5.5 million square km it is so big that the UK and Ireland would fit into it 17 times!</li> <li>The Amazon is found in South America, spanning across 9 countries</li> <li>Running through the north of the rainforest is the <b>Amazon River</b> — a network of many hundreds of waterways that stretches <b>6,840km</b></li> <li>Around 400-500 indigenous <b>Amerindian</b> tribes call the Amazon rainforest home.</li> <li>The Amazon has around <b>40,000 plant species, 1,300 bird species, 3,000 types of fish, 430 mammals</b> and a whopping <b>2.5 million different insects</b>.</li> </ul>	<p><b>Arid</b> – little or no rain, barren</p> <p><b>Fertile</b> – antonym for arid</p> <p><b>Craggy</b> – rock or rough cliff face</p> <p><b>Densely</b> – close together, crowded</p> <p><b>Climate</b> – the average weather conditions over time</p> <p><b>Biodiversity</b> – The wide variety of living things on the earth</p> <p><b>Canopy</b> – the tallest layer of trees in a rainforest</p> <p><b>Scenery</b> – natural features of the landscape</p> <p><b>Abundant</b> – available in large quantities</p> <p><b>Picturesque</b> – visually attractive</p> <p><b>Appreciate</b> – recognise the full worth</p> <p><b>Exceptional</b> – unusual, not typical</p> <p><b>Exhilarating</b> - a feeling of intense happiness and joy</p>
