Bricks and concrete may look as hard as rocks, but are made by humans. They are not rocks.</li> <li>Clothes are made from fabrics. Fabric is a material. A rock is a material. A spoon is not hard- the metal the spoon is made of is hard. Metal is a hard material that has been used to make a spoon.</li> <li>In 1666, a huge fire that started in a tiny bakery burned down most of London. The fire was so big that it was called the Great Fire of London.</li> <li>The fire lasted four days, and burned down over 13,000 homes. There are a lot of reasons why the fire was so large, mostly to do with the way houses were built – a lot of them were made from wood, and were very close together.</li> </ul>	<p><b><u>Translucent</u></b> Partly see-through.</p> <p><b><u>Opaque</u></b> Not see-through.</p> <p><b><u>Monarch</u></b> A sovereign head of state, especially a king, queen, or emperor.</p> <p><b><u>Flammable</u></b> Easily set on fire.</p> <p><b><u>Artefacts</u></b> Things made by people.</p> <p><b><u>Sacred</u></b> If something is sacred it is said to be holy or connected with a god.</p> <p><b><u>Maquette</u></b> a small drawing or model that is used as the basis for a sculpture.</p>
