


The South Pole is also called Antarctica and no one lives there. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Continent – A large area of land containing countries. Atlas – A book of maps. Vast – A big stretch of land. Ocean – A large area of salt water made up of seas. Polar – Relating to the North and South Poles. Expanse – A wide and open area or land. Deciduous – Trees that shed leaves in autumn. Evergreen – Trees that keep their leaves all year round. Nutrients – Things needed for life and growth.
