




Who was Carl Linnaeus and what did he do? 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The British Nationality Act was passed, which gave everyone who lived in the UK, or any of the British colonies around the world, the same rights to live and work in the UK. At the time, Jamaica’s economy was struggling, and they were still suffering from the effects of a dangerous hurricane. Many people made the decision to buy tickets to Britain with the hope of a better, more prosperous life. Between 1500 and 1800, around 12-15 million people were taken by force from Africa to be used as enslaved labour in the Caribbean, North, Central and South America. The transatlantic slave trade was the largest forced migration in history. More than 10,000 Caribbean people supported Britain in WW2 as they believe Hitler would reinstate enslavement. Sadly, all generations of the Windrush pioneers have experienced racism and prejudice. The Windrush pioneers had a wide range of skills and talents, including judges, lawyers, builders, carpenters, and barbers. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Emigrate - to leave your own country to live permanently in another country. Discrimination - unjust treatment of others because of age, gender, beliefs, or race. Prejudice - an unfavourable opinion or thought not based on facts or reason. Racism - showing hostility or dislike to someone due to the colour of their skin. Segregation - setting groups apart because of their race, gender, or beliefs. Diversity – a range of different things. Disembarked – getting off a ship or aircraft. Demobilised - troops being removed from active service. Iniquitous - very unfair and morally wrong.
